



Graduate Student Stipend Opportunity Canadian Work Disability Policy Research

The Centre for Research on Work Disability Policy (CRWDP) is a transdisciplinary initiative on the future of work disability policy in Canada. We are a national initiative with clusters in British Columbia, Ontario, Québec, and Newfoundland. We received funding from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) for a period of seven years beginning in 2013.

Illness and disability touch most people at some point over their lifetime. CRWDP's objective is to identify how people, when disabled, can be better retained and integrated into the Canadian labour market.

CRWDP has laid the foundations for a rich training and mentoring program for graduate students. This includes 70 graduate stipend years of funding for masters and doctoral students over the seven-year SSHRC funding period. Pending confirmation of funding, there should be a one-year stipend opportunity available to a Memorial University graduate student for the 2017-2018 academic year.
