







# Opportunities Fund for Persons with Disabilities

Program Results - 2016-17

4,630 Served

\$40M per year

 Supports persons with disabilities prepare for, obtain and maintain employment or become self-employed, increasing their economic participation and independence

3,195 Enhanced Employability

> 2,142 Employed



# **Labour Market Transfer Agreements**



Nearly \$3 Billion is transferred annually to provinces and territories through bilateral agreements to support employment and training programs.

- Labour Market Development Agreements
- Canada Job Fund Agreements
- Labour Market Agreements for Persons with Disabilities
- Targeted Initative for Older Workers (expired March 31, 2017)






#### Labour Market Agreements for Persons with Disabilities

 Government of Canada's single largest source of employment support for persons with disabilities

# Currently \$222M transferred to Provinces and Territories which is cost-matched



- \$192M based on predecessor programs' historical spending
- \$30M based on equal per capita with base amount for smaller jurisdictions





# Labour Market Agreements for Persons with Disabilities (continued)

300,000 employment-enhancing interventions





Over 115 programs and services across Canada

Program delivery by Provinces and Territories allows for flexibility to meet the needs of persons with disabilities in local labour markets





## Renewing the Transfer Agreements

#### 2015 Mandate Letter of the Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Labour

Commitment to work with the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development to improve workers' access to good quality job training, including:

Rationalizing and expanding the intergovernmental agreements that support skills training:

- Labour Market Development Agreements
- Canada Job Fund Agreements
- Targeted Initiative for Older Workers and
- Labour Market Agreements for Persons with Disabilities





#### **Consultations with Stakeholders**



Federal, provincial and territorial governments held consultations on labour market transfers in 2016

Stakeholders representing employers, labour, service providers and experts called for agreements that:

- Provide flexibility
- Support measurable, positive outcomes
- Foster innovation and inclusive growth

### **Budget 2017 (continued)**

#### **Modernize Labour Market Transfer Agreements**

#### Additional investments of \$900M over six years

New Workforce Development agreements

#### Additional \$1.8B over six years for LMDAs

 Amend the EI Act to broaden eligibility of workers under LMDAs





## **Delivery Expectations**

- Provinces and Territories will continue to design and deliver programming
- ✓ New performance measurement strategy
  - Collection of data to track outcomes and trends
  - Informed evidence-based decisions
- ✓ Improve reporting to Canadians about the successes of labour market programming





#### **Current Status**

- Bilateral negotiations with most Provinces and Territories (P/T) are underway
- A performance measurement strategy was endorsed by the Forum of Labour Market Ministers (FLMM) on October 24<sup>th</sup>
